Stewardship Update 2016 & Thank you for your Support of McClure and Its Programs

As we approach the hustle and bustle of the a Christmas season please take time to look around and think of what McClure has done as a collective group within our community, nationally and internationally. Your support of the church's mission, 50th anniversary, outreach to local organizations, refugee support, and support of M&S is nothing short of fantastic.

Thank You, everyone.

In preparation for 2017, we are budgeting and need your help. Please consider your intentions for support of McClure, if not already done so through your commitment card, and help us plan for next year. Your commitment and information you provide will help us to plan, continue and initiate meaningful and much needed church programs. Commitment cards are available at the church office or on the Stewardship rack in the lobby. Help us start 2017 with confidence and optimism.

The close out of the 2016 year financially, for a McClure was optimistic, with a deficit a situation being much smaller than last vear up to October. November, 2016 was a good month for giving and Faith in Action, but our recovery from last year was severely tested two bills for building repair with approximately \$13,000. These repair bills were unexpected and shows how snug our church budget is. The bright side is that even with these bills our year to Nov 30 deficit is \$31,930, while last year's (2015) deficit at the same time was \$37,476. It should be noted that we finished last year with a \$23,772 deficit and with your help we can close this year's gap some more over the next couple of weeks in December.

Thank you to those that have already considered, and reconsidered, your commitment. And God Bless each and every one of you in this holy season.

Keeping the Clock of Life Ticking

At the end of 2015, thanks to support from United Church Women, Mission & Service partner Morogoro Women's Training Centre had provided maternal health worker training to over 500 women working as traditional birth attendants, or midwives, across Tanzania. Collaborating with the Tanzanian Ministry of Health, this program is part of a national objective to reduce mother and infant deaths in Tanzania.

The training builds on existing skills and expertise for women already working as traditional birth attendants. For many it is their first formal training. Some learned their skills from mothers, aunts, and grandmothers, and many others through lived experience. All are deeply committed to caring for mothers and infants and improving the outcomes of deliveries.

One of the women, Molen Abdul, has been delivering babies in her village for more than 47 years. During that time she has encountered many challenges and is happy to learn more about how to manage potential crises for the benefit of mother and child. Molen says, "This is very important to me. It is like it keeps the clock of life ticking."

Norah Robert Mallya has helped deliver babies in buses, churches, and all the surrounding villages. She is happy to have received training that will improve her skills and knowledge.

We are thankful for our gifts for Mission & Service that support our partners to make a real difference in the lives of women and children in Tanzania.
